


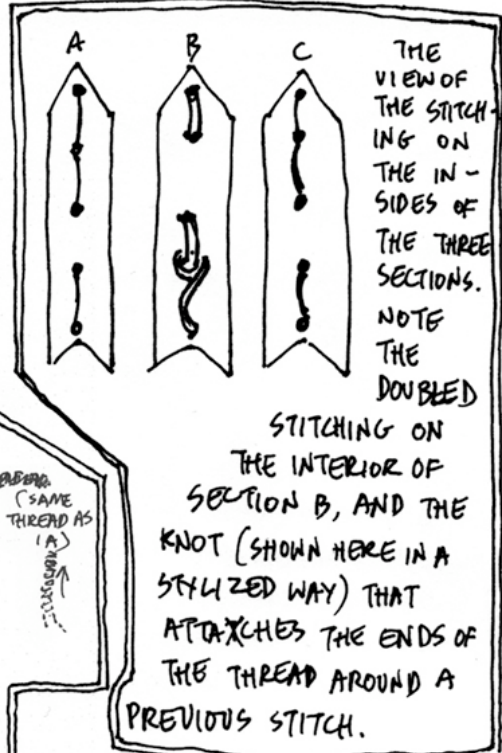
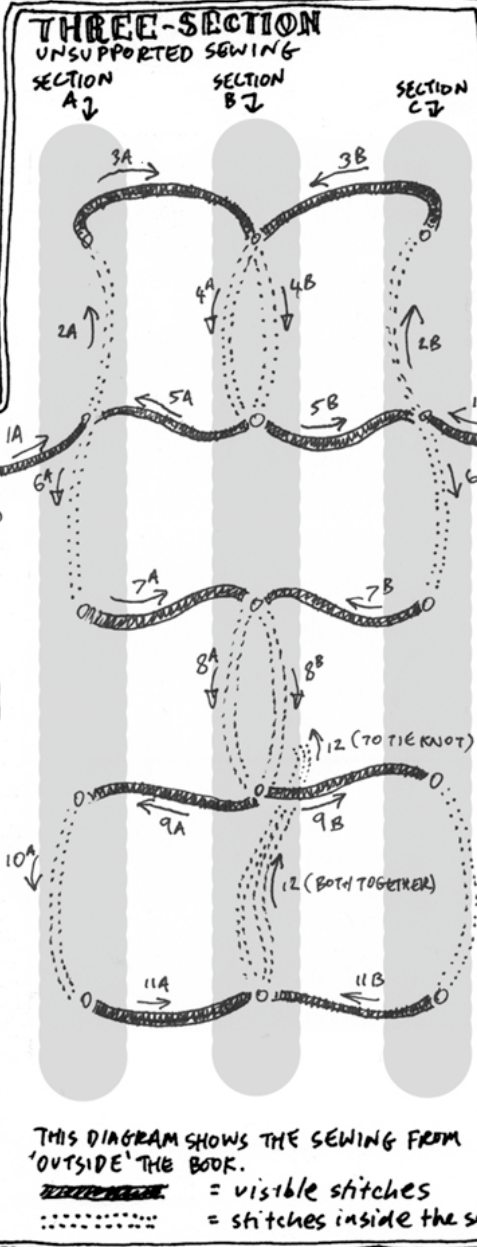
- 1 SET UP THREE SECTIONS WITH FIVE HOLES IN EACH.
THREAD TWO NEEDLES AND PIERCE SECTIONS A AND C, SECOND HOLE DOWN FROM THE HEAD [STEPS 1A & 1B ON THE DIAGRAM]
- 2 WITH BOTH NEEDLES, PROCEED UP THE INSIDE OF THE SECTIONS TO THE TOP HOLES AND EXIT TO THE OUTSIDE [2A & 2B]
- 3 GO TOWARDS THE CENTRE SECTION WITH BOTH NEEDLES, ENTERING SECTION B THROUGH THE TOP HOLE [3A & 3B]

THIS SEWING
IS QUITE AN EFFECTIVE WAY OF SOWING TOGETHER ENOUGH SECTIONS TO MAKE QUITE A WORTHWHILE SIMPLE BOOK. SOME OTHER SIMPLE SEWINGS ARE REALLY MEANT FOR A LARGER NUMBER OF SECTIONS. IT'S QUITE IMPORTANT WITH THIS ONE TO TIGHTEN THE SEWING AS YOU GO. 



THE BACK OF YOUR BOOK WILL END UP LOOKING SOMETHING LIKE THE DRAWING TO THE LEFT. NOTE THE DOUBLE STITCH ON THE SECOND ROW DOWN, WHERE THE FIRST PAIR OF STITCHES BEGAN.

- 4 PROCEED DOWN THE INSIDE OF SECTION B TO THE SECOND HOLE, AND EXIT TO OUTSIDE [4A & 4B]
- 5 USING BOTH NEEDLES, HEAD ACROSS TO THE NEARBY SECOND HOLES IN SECTIONS A AND C [STEPS 5A & 5B]
- 6 HEAD DOWN THE INSIDES OF THE RESPECTIVE SECTIONS AND EXIT TO THE OUTSIDE AT THE THIRD HOLE DOWN [6A & 6B]
- 7 GO TOWARDS THE CENTRE SECTION WITH BOTH NEEDLES, ENTERING SECTION B THROUGH THE THIRD HOLE DOWN [7A & 7B]



- 8 PROCEED DOWN THE INSIDE OF SECTION B TO THE FOURTH HOLE DOWN, AND EXIT TO THE OUTSIDE [8A & 8B]
- 9 USING BOTH NEEDLES, HEAD ACROSS TO THE NEARBY FOURTH HOLES IN SECTIONS A AND C [STEPS 9A & 9B]
- 10 HEAD DOWN THE INSIDES OF THE RESPECTIVE SECTIONS AND EXIT TO THE OUTSIDE AT THE BOTTOM HOLE [10A & 10B]
- 11 GO TOWARDS THE CENTRE SECTION WITH BOTH NEEDLES, ENTERING SECTION B THROUGH THE BOTTOM HOLE.
- 12 GATHER BOTH THREADS AND PROCEED UPWARDS TOWARDS THE FOURTH HOLE INSIDE SECTION B. DO NOT EXIT TO THE OUTSIDE. INSTEAD, TAKE YOUR NEEDLES UNDER STITCH 'B' AS IT ENITS AND USE THIS ANCHOR TO TIGHTEN UP THE STITCHING AND TIE A KNOT.
- 13 ERRR...
- 14 THAT'S IT...

Although there are a lot of steps to this sewing, the symmetry and its repetitive nature make it reasonably easy to remember. Right. There's just enough room left for a dog:
